Meet Bob



Bob is legally female

Sex Self-ID gives men the key to access spaces reserved for women and girls

Bob is a 47 year old man who is very sporty – he swims & plays footy. On the surface Bob looks like a typical bloke and even wears a beard.

Deep down, Bob feels that he is really a woman. So Bob goes online and fills in a form to change his recorded sex. He does not need to tell anyone, or visit a doctor.

In fact Bob does not wish to medically **transition.** He continues to wear what he is most comfortable in - jeans and t-shirts, and keeps his beard.

Bob is legally entitled to use female toilets at work, even if his coworkers are uncomfortable with him there.

After work he visits a pool and changes in the female change rooms where little girls are showering naked. A mother complains but is told that **Bob is legally female and** has a right to be in this female-only space.
